

I am a huge fan of John and Barbara Gerlach's tremendous gift for shooting exquisite images and teaching others how to do it. Like all of their books, Digital Nature Photography—The Art and the Science is exceptionally well done. Although it is the second edition of their first book that was published several years ago, everything in the book is completely new.

The entire book has been rewritten from scratch and more than 150 new images illustrate the key concepts they so thoroughly explain. Here's a list of the chapters:

This book is packed with cutting-edge information that will help you consistently capture spectacular images. All of the chapters are incredibly helpful to beginners and pros alike, but the information on focus stacking, outdoor flash, and the night sky will take your photography in an entirely new direction. At a recent workshop I attended, John said "focus stacking is the most important new photo technique that has become available in my forty year photography career."

That says a lot!

The chapter on using flash in outdoor photography is all by itself worth the price of this book. Always pushing the boundaries, the Gerlach's have figured out ways to use flash that vastly expand the art of flash photography. While everyone has heard of fill flash, the more useful ways to use flash include balanced flash, main flash for controlling the brightness of the background, and multiple flash.

As with the entire series of instructional photo books from John and Barb, this one is a gold mine of inspiring images and game-changing information.

Reading their books, magazine articles, and participating in their field workshops has profoundly improved my photography and it well do the same for you!

It is often said that a great writer can't teach or that a fabulous teacher can't write, but I beg to disagree. An example of two amazing and incredible photographers who can also write are John and Barbara Gerlach. I bring to your attention their most recently published book, Digital Nature Photography. If you have the first edition, you may think you don't need the Second Edition, but the book is completely rewritten. The emphasis is on focus stacking, formidable techniques for shooting the night sky, and new multiple exposure applications for focusing both the foreground and the background. For those of you who never use flash in landscape photography, you've missed important topics covered in this book. You not only learn how to use flash in landscape shooting, but illustrations show side by side comparison photographs letting you see the differences between with flash and without flash. Using comparison is a remarkable teaching technique. The book also shows you, the reader, what your photos have been missing by not using flash. Finally, the authors teach you how to customize your camera to make it more intuitive. Lastly the Gerlach's cover exposure as well as how to shoot sharp photos every time. This is an all business, no nonsense book but a fun reading book. Brand new up to date techniques in a completely rewritten book by the best teachers and best writers in the market today.
